Description			
<i>Provide a short description of the event and its activities.</i>			
<p>The event was dedicated to the commemoration of the Chortiatis Holocaust, one of the most tragic massacres during the Nazi occupation of Greece. It began with a historical overview of the period 1941–1944, delivered by a historian who contextualized the events leading up to the atrocity. The lecture was enriched by powerful visual material, including rare photographs and archival documentation that brought to life the suffering endured by the local population.</p>			

A central part of the event was the presentation of research findings that focused on survivor testimonies, personal narratives, and official reports — most notably the detailed account by the Red Cross. These materials not only documented the events but also highlighted the enduring trauma and resilience of the affected community.

The presence of a representative from the Association of Families of the Victims of the Chortiatis Holocaust lent a personal and deeply emotional dimension to the proceedings. Their reflections underscored the importance of preserving historical memory and honoring the victims with dignity.

The event concluded with a meaningful dialogue between the speakers and attendees, where participants were encouraged to reflect on the lessons of the past and the role of collective remembrance in building a more just and humane society.
